## HEALTHCARE ADVOCACY: Senior Transportation Options in Marin County

If you are a member of <u>Sausalito Village</u>, you already know that transportation is available to you for medical appointments anywhere in Marin County thanks to our vetted and trained volunteer drivers. What other options are available for seniors in Marin County? Here are some highlights of programs available:

### Carepool

**What is it?** Volunteer driver program run by Whistlestop. Vetted volunteer drivers will drive you anywhere in the County for medical appointments or food shopping

When do you need to call? Phone a week or more in advance. What number do you need to call? 415-454-0902 How much does it cost? Free

#### CARSS (Call A Ride for Sausalito Seniors)

What is it? City of Sausalito Age Friendly program managed by Sausalito Village. Vetted volunteer drivers will drive you anywhere in Sausalito area up to 3 stops per day (examples: CVS, Target and Mollie Stones)
When do you need to call? Either up to a week ahead or during the weekday shift of 10am-2pm
What number do you call? 415-944-5474
How much does it cost? Free

#### Whistlestop Paratransit Van

What is it? Transportation via a wheelchair accessible van anywhere for any reason
When do you need to call? Call at least 4 days ahead
What number do you call? 415-454-0964
How much does it cost? Under \$3 per ride

#### Catch A Ride Taxi (Marin Access)

What is it? Discounted taxi rides, approximately the FIRST \$14 of a ride, \$18 if you are income eligible. Maximum 8 one-way, or 4 roundtrip rides per month

When do you need to call? At least 3 hours ahead of needed ride What number do you call? 415-454-0902, press #3

**How much does it cost?** When you call, they will tell you how much the ride will be. Must pay cash.

You may make a lifelong friend!

**Buddy List Matching:** Help keep the Buddy system organized. Make sure that anyone who wants a Buddy gets paired up. Follow up with the Buddy pairs to make sure the lines of communication are open and working.
