

About twelve years ago she retired from teaching ESL at City College.

Sharon has been dedicated to volunteering and organizing community events that speak to her passions. She has been a past board member of the Sausalito Historical Society and she continues to volunteer chairing the Accessions Committee, and she continues to volunteer working on their digital collection, digitizing artifacts and historical documents onto the Society software program. She came to know Susan and Phil Frank, and a lot of other locals over her years volunteering there.

She became interested in The Sausalito Village when her friend, Betsy Stroman invited her to a meeting to discuss forming a village in Sausalito. Sharon became one of the founding members of the Village, and served on its board for many years, helping to coordinate monthly meetings to recruit new members.

Over the years, Sharon has developed and directed trips to museums and noteworthy destinations for village members. She is currently the Zoom Manager for Chair Yoga, now called Stretch and Strengthen, and organizes the book club and cocktail hour for village members as well.

Since 1990 she has been a member of the Sausalito Woman's Club serving on the History Committee and is currently chair of the SWC History Committee. She has served on the SWC board twice, most recently as the first Vice President.

Sharon loves the small town feel of Sausalito and she admits "My first love is the Historical Society."

Finally, Sharon notes, "The Sausalito Village gives me the opportunity to work with great people and socialize with them locally."

Sharon Seymour was a founding member of Sausalito Village and has volunteered non-stop for over ten years - mostly 'behind the scenes'.
