California's Coast: Living on the Living Edge Friday, October 5, 7:00 pm Library

Join environmental writer and marine wildlife photographer Kim Steinhardt for an inspiring photographic journey into the California coast's past, present and probable future with environmental, historical, and colorful personal anecdotes from a lifetime growing up on the California coast, including in Marin County. Kim will also discuss the issues in his new book, *The Edge: The Pressured Past and Precarious Future of California's Coast*, co-authored with coastal science expert Gary Griggs. Kim's photographic work and storytelling has been recognized by National Geographic Books, where he has served as an advisor and photo contributor regarding sea otters.

Master Gardener Series: Mini-Succulent Gardens Thursday, October 25, 7:00 pm Council Chambers

Succulents are attractive easy-care, low-water plants that come in all sorts of shapes and sizes. Come and learn how to incorporate these versatile plants into mini-gardens, using common household objects like teacups and cookie tins as containers. Presenter Diane Lynch has been a Master Gardener in Marin since 1999.

Friday Evening Program Series: Sterling Hayden Friday, October 26, 7:00 pm Library

Sterling Hayden (1916-1986) was a Hollywood actor, author, and sailor. Sausalito became Sterling's part-time home beginning in the early1960s. In his later years, Sterling was a common sight in downtown Sausalito and along the waterfront with his long beard and walking stick. Sterling's film credits include Doctor Strangelove, The Killing, the Asphalt Jungle, and The Godfather. His memoir "Wanderer" is still in print, fifty-five years after it was first published. Please join the Sausalito Library and the Sausalito Historical Society as we celebrate a unique Sausalito character with film clips, readings, and reminiscences from some of the local people who knew him.

Flushable Wipes Are NOT Flushable!

Several Village members took a tour last month of the Sausalito-Marin City Water Sanitary District that is located on East Gate Road, right in our neighborhood!

Major construction is currently underway to improve the quality of the water we put back into the Bay but there are simple things that we, as consumers can do. Most importantly, remember - your toilet is NOT a trash bin. There are only three things that should go into your toilet: urine, feces and toilet paper. Nothing else....repeat....nothing else.

Recently, one of the largest producers of 'flushable' toilet wipes was fined \$700,000 because the wipes are indeed, not flushable. These wipes do not disintegrate in the toilet and clog up the sewerage systems. You can read more in this article at **The Conversation**.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

The Open Door Friday Night Food Program has been serving hot meals and providing clothing to needy folks in Sausalito for more than 40 years. Volunteers are always needed.

Cooking

- 3 Volunteers needed to each cook a main dish to serve 20 people
- 1 Volunteer needed to cook a vegetable dish to serve 40 people
- 1 Volunteer needed to prepare a green salad to serve 40 people

Clothing Room - 1 Volunteer needed to service the clothing closet

During each quarter of the year, each cooking volunteer usually makes a main dish for one week, and a vegetable dish or salad for another week. This volunteer opportunity is very flexible, depending on your available time and schedule. Prepared dishes are brought to the Open Door Program, which operates out of Sausalito Christian Fellowship Church (formerly First Baptist Church of Sausalito), at 131 Filbert Street.

There are six active volunteers for the Clothing Room - anyone interested in joining the team would be very welcome!
