NEW MONTHLY COLUMN Are You Ready for the Next Emergency?

The recent PG&E Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS) revealed that it does take a village to pull through an emergency, as businesses, agencies and individuals throughout our community rose to the challenge of living without electricity for three days. The Sausalito Library was the town's official 9-9 hub for powering up devices, connecting to the internet or making phone calls. Molly Stone's and Driver's Market remained open and neighbors flocked there for food and company; both places also provided power strips.

It's safe to say that we're all at least a little bit more prepared for the next PSPS.

Preparing for an emergency can feel like an overwhelming project, so associations like Ready Marin https://readymarin.org/plan-prepare/ suggest dividing the project into small chunks. With that in mind, beginning this month the Village newsletter will provide emergency preparedness tips and ideas to help ensure you are safe and ready.

Here is a bare bones list of what you should have on hand for the next PSPS:

- Minimum of three days non-perishable food and manual can opener (protein bars, canned fish/meats, dried fruits/nuts, peanut or almond butter, crackers
- Pet Food
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Prescription Medicines
- Non prescription medicines (pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medicine, antacids, laxatives)
- Glasses and contact lens solution
- Cash in small bills
- N95 Smoke filter masks ?????
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket
- Portable charger for cell phone
- Toilet paper
- Other???

NOTE: Since last month we have learned that dry ice off-gasses toxic carbon dioxide. Avoid purchasing/using.

Tips:

- 1. Talk with your neighbors about checking in on each other immediately following an emergency.
- 2. Make an extra set of keys for someone you trust.
- 3. Inform neighbors when you will be out of town and about your pets.
- 4. Remember it is sometimes possible to connect via phone with a contact outside the impacted area.
- 5. Original landlines not dependent on electricity often work.
- 6. Practice texting. This service often works even when phone is not operational.

Road Scholar started in 1975 with he name 'Elderhostel'. It's original concept was as a budget educational travel program for older adults. The first trips were based at universities in New England where attendees were housed in dormitories and college professors taught noncredit courses in different areas of study. By 1980 the program grew to all 50 states.

The name eventually changed to Road Scholar and the dormitories were replaced with comfortable lodgings. Road Scholar now offers 5,500 learning adventures, serving more than 100,000 participants annually. The programs still combine travel and education to provide experiential learning opportunities in every state in the U.S., 150 countries and aboard ships on rivers and oceans worldwide. 
