Academic and educator Robin DiAngelo has been running diversity-training and cultural-competency workshops for American companies for more than 20 years.



Looking at the picture, I realized that the essence of the artist's life is his art. And so, I let the painting write the song for me." Internationally, the song **"Vincent"** was a bigger hit than "American Pie." In 1972, it reached #1 in the UK and #12 in the USA. Watch McLean strum his guitar and sing this beloved song.
